Director's Letter

I've been a fan of a good farce for many, many years. Duck Soup and every Marx brothers movie, Arsenic and Old Lace, anything by Monty Python, Mel Brooks' Young Frankenstein – I love them all!

What is farce? Historically, it is a type of broadly satirical comedy that uses exaggeration, ridiculous situations, mistaken identity, and improbable plots, with no intention to do anything other than make the audience laugh. Modern farce may have grown out of the 13th-century French practice of adding explanatory phrases to Latin church texts. A few centuries later it evolved, or maybe devolved, with the addition of physical comedy, clowning, the reversal of social roles, and indecency of all kinds. Another possibility is that it grew from ancient Greek theatre, when the comic relief (known as satyr plays) were introduced between the tragedies on stage. I don't know for sure, but as the saying goes "I know it when I see it"!

The Red Lamp, written by Hilliard Booth and set in 1914 America, is a pretty perfect example of farce. It involves young lovers, a social climbing spinster, mistaken identities, lots of surprises, and the requisite happy ending. I laughed out loud when I read it the first time, and I have laughed every night of rehearsal. What a great cast I have had the pleasure of working with on this show, with a production team that is first-rate. I wouldn't want to do this without them! And I couldn't do it without them, so thank you everyone involved in this production.

I hope you enjoy watching The Red Lamp as much as I've enjoyed directing it -
